

French course. A2 level

Two types of course are held: four-month term and intensive.

TYPE: Four-month term

DURATION: 110 hours split over two four-month terms*:

- 1st Term – A2.1 (55 hours)
- 2nd Term – A2.2 (55 hours)

PLACE: Vigo Campus.

EXAM: There is an exam to test the level at the end of the second term.

TYPE: Intensive. Courses held mainly over the summer period.

DURATION: 80 hours divided into two levels:

- Level A2.1 (40 hours)
- Level A2.2 (40 hours)

PLACE: Vigo Campus.

EXAM: There is an exam to test A2.2 level at the end of the course.

Aims

Acquire a basic knowledge of French. Aimed at people with prior knowledge of the language.

According to the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR), A2 Level has been attained when the students are capable of understanding and employing frequently-used expressions concerning areas of experience that are particularly familiar to them (basic information about themselves and their family, shopping, places of interest, jobs, etc.); when they can communicate to carry out straightforward daily tasks that do not require more than simple direct exchanges dealing with information on questions that they know about or are commonplace; and when they know how to describe aspects about their past and their environment in simple terms, as well as issues regarding their immediate needs.

Requirements

Level A2.1: have basic knowledge of the language, an A1 level qualification or by taking a level test.

Level A2.2: basic knowledge of the language, by having taken Level A2.1 or a level test.

Certificates

- ATTENDANCE CERTIFICATE: this requires attendance at 85% of the classes.
- LEVEL CERTIFICATE: if the final course exam is passed.
