

English course. A2 level

TYPE: Four-month term

DURATION: 110 hours split into two four-month terms of 55 hours*:

- 1st Term – A2.1 (September - December)
- 2nd Term – A2.2 (January - May)

PLACE: Vigo Campus.

EXAM: There is an exam to test the level at the end of the second term.

Aims

Acquire a basic knowledge of English. Aimed at people with basic knowledge of the language.

According to the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR), A2 Level has been attained when the students are capable of understanding and employing frequently-used expressions concerning areas of experience that are particularly familiar to them (basic information about themselves and their family, shopping, places of interest, jobs, etc.); when they can communicate to carry out straightforward daily tasks that do not require more than simple direct exchanges dealing with information on questions that they know about or are commonplace; and when they know how to describe aspects about their past and their environment in simple terms, as well as issues regarding their immediate needs.

Requirements

In order to access the A2 level course applicants must have a basic knowledge of English that can be accredited by providing an A1 level certificate (obtained within the last three years) or by taking a level test.

Applicants who have been awarded any of the following in the last 3 years are exempt from the level test:

- Basic level from the Escuela Oficial de Idiomas (Official Language School).
- Level A1 accreditation issued by the Centro de Linguas (Language Centre).
- Cambridge KET.

Certificates

- ATTENDANCE CERTIFICATE: this requires attendance at 85% of the classes.

- LEVEL CERTIFICATE: if the final course exam is passed.
